- **International students** are required by law to enroll in a full course of study for each Fall and Spring semester. Students are only required to register in the Summer semester if it is their first or last semester and then they must register full-time. This generally means that students must register as follows:
 - Fall and Spring semesters
 - Graduate student with assistantship = minimum 6 credit hours/semester
 - Graduate student without assistantship = minimum 8 credit hours/semester
 - Summer semester, if it is the first or last semester
 - Graduate student with assistantship = minimum 3 credit hours/semester
 - Graduate student without assistantship = minimum 6 credit hours/semester
