- Does it work?

Challenges

- What was interesting or challenging about this project?
- What did you learn?
- What could the rest of the class learn from your experience?

Future Work

- What is left to do?
 - Which requirements were not met?
- How could it be made better?
 - Additional features
 - Different design, technologies
