Walter Gautschi: celebrating 80 years of his life

As part of a belated 80th birthday celebration on September 27, 2008 (instead of December 11, 2007) the following mock interview was read by the undersigned during a dinner party at *Jane's Gourmet Deli & Catering*, Lafayette, Indiana. [I=interviewer, G=Gautschi (supposedly)]

- G: Ja, Ja. It was either mathematics or making fondue. I love Swiss cheese. But the case for making fondue has too many holes in it. So mathematics won out.
- I: Did you have a mathematical hero?
- G: Euler. He was Swiss, you know.

- I: How did you decide to come to Purdue?
- G: I had to. They were the Euler-makers¹.
- I: I heard that at Purdue you worked on numerical analysis. What is numerical analysis?
- G: You know what psychoanalysis is?
- I: Yes.
- G: Well, it's nothing like that.
- I: Let's talk about your taste in food. What is your favorite cuisine?
- G: Italian, anything with Basel².
- I: How about pasta? What kind do you like best? Spaghetti? Linguini? Penne?
- G: Bernoulli. It's Swiss.
- I: I'm told you enjoy music. What is your favorite musical ensemble?
- G: The Swiss wind quintet.
- I: I'm afraid I don't know them. What instruments are in this group?
- G: Flute, clarinet, French horn, English horn, and Matterhorn.
- I: And who is your favorite composer?
- G: Beethoven. He wasn't Swiss, but almost. He wrote three symphonies: the Eroica, the Pastoral, and the Ninth.
- I: Which is your favorite?
- G: The Erika³, of course. Look, it's getting late. I have to run home and wind my cuckoo clocks.
- G: (to himself) I had a good interview. But it wasn't this one.
